

came to Clemson and left with an education that greatly impacted her future. Hyde entered Clemson in 1976 and graduated with a B.S. in math in 1980. She continued her education at Clemson to earn a master's in that same field. But Hyde didn't stop there. While in graduate school, she was awarded an assistantship - an important factor in helping her with tuition. In 1987 she earned her Ph.D. in management science. In 2015 Hyde created the Aull Family First-Generation Scholarship Endowment that will provide merit-based, need-based scholarships to first-generation students enrolled in the Clemson FIRST Program and the College of Engineering and Applied Science. Recipients must be residents of South Carolina. Hyde said when she was at Clemson the tuition cost was supplemented more by the state.
